Regional Ratepayers Association of Cairns Inc is pleased to advise all members the Public Liability Insurance has been paid in full. Thank you to the volunteers who assisted with the sausage sizzle held at IGA Piccones Manunda to raise funds along with donations from members: some very substantial amounts. Maintenance has been carried out in Moody and Chinnaman Creeks: Saltwater Creek maintenance at this point and time is being carried out from 10mtrs wide to its specified 33mtrs wide in preparation to assist the communities to reduce the level of flooding this wet season.

The Association will be pressing to have monies set aside in the October/ November budget for 2010 works to continue for the upgrade of Moody, Cochrane and McCoombe Streets crossings: with the land set aside in 1996 off Irene Street for a retention basin and more basins up stream of Moody Street Crossing: to cope with the increased hydraulic run off from the already developed hillslopes.

At a public meeting on 7th July 2009 the community was informed by council representatives of the upgrade of Moody Creek crossing would commence in approximately two weeks time: this has not commenced to date. The preliminary survey is currently underway for the drainage system.
